# WILL CURTIS ... OUR BRIGHTEST STAR

Recently 17 year old **Will Curtis** was named in the Australian Junior Team to compete at the World Junior Championships in Poland in August.



Will is the youngest member of the four man Aussie team to contest the World Teams Championships in Bielsko-Biala from 12-16 August. He joins Alex Eustace, Joseph White and Alex Oswald.

Born in the UK (Leicester) the talented teenager moved to Australia when he was three and a half and took up the sport when he was eight just for fun with his dad and older brother.

In the early days Will progressed under the watchful eye of Sanny Ang at Mullaloo squash and took part in the Saturday morning juniors. He also had coaching once a week for half an hour.

His first taste of representative squash came in 2012 when Will was named in the WA state team in the 13 year age group. Will won his first match up in three but lost in straight to the #2 seed Jacob Salmon in the next round.

However, there was some consolation

for the new kid on the block when he won the 9-16 play off in three. It was an encouraging result for the 15th seed and it may have just fuelled his fire to improve.

In fact Will improved immediately with a emphatic 3-0 thrashing of that same #2 seed in the teams event and then he beat the newly crowned Australian Junior Champion Nicholas McCoombes in four.

Will finished undefeated in the teams event. It was a remarkable turnaround and a wonderful sign for the future.

In mid 2013 Will began training with a new coach Geoff Davenport. Geoff is a 5 times World Masters Champion and well placed to guide and comment on Will's ability.

"Will is potentially the best player I've seen for many years, probably since Ryan Cuskelly. I think he is actually better than Ryan was at a similar age" said Davenport.

Given Cuskelly has reached a career high World Ranking of 15 that is potentially great news for Australia.

Davenport added "Will is a shot player with the

capacity to change game plans if necessary. He can slot nicks when needed. Will doesn't seem to have any fear of the score. If the ball is there to nick he will go for it, similar to the great Ramy Ashour, which is a fantastic trait to have."

This was certainly evident in 2014 at the Australian Junior Open Championships in Victoria. Installed as the #1 seed in the U15 Boys event Will faced #2 seed Nicholas Calvert in the final and won a nail biting contest 11-8, 11-9, 7-11, 8-11, 12-10 in 62 minutes. In the closing minutes of that match Will slotted a nick off serve that changed the momentum of the match.

Summed up best by coach Davenport "I'm sure he will live by the sword and die by the sword at different times in his career but it will always be good to watch!"

In 2014 Will was selected in the Trans Tasman Australian squad. It was his first experience of training with players from other states and the start of some long lasting friendships.

In 2015 Will once again displayed good form at the AJO in the U17 Boys event with another 5 game victory over Nicholas Calvert in the semi finals 7-11, 11-9, 10-12, 11-4, 11-6 (66m) fighting back from 1-2 down.



Will had reached his second AJO final in as many years and went on to win the title beating Kiwi Rafa Yam 11-8, 11-8, 11-8 in a brisk 28 minutes.

In May 2015 Will played in his first PSA event (City of Perth WA Open) winning his opening round in five against Anthony Shear 3-11, 11-6, 6-11, 15-13, 11-6 (40m) before losing to the #1 seed Dane Sharp in straight in the 2nd round.

Will began 2016 in style with a victory in the Oceania Squash Championships winning the U17 Boys event against Malaysian Sunil Kumar Sivanesan 11-5, 11-8, 11-8 in 35 minutes.

Despite returning to Sydney, Geoff Davenport continues to work with Will guiding his long term development.

"Will is a very driven young man who

eats, sleeps and breathes squash. He is highly motivated and does a lot of training by himself.

In 2014 I introduced him to Ben Werchon, a former player I coached, to assist with a strength program. Will still works with Ben and recently I organized for Will to start doing some work with Ken Watson and Glen Hitch. He is in very good hands." said Davenport.



player, David Illich. Currently in Year 12 Will trains twice a day with one day off each week. When not playing squash Will likes to spend time with his mates and enjoys playing basketball.

He also enjoys travelling and besides holidays in the UK Will has travelled to Kuala Lumpur, Penang and Singapore as part of the 2014 Australian Squad tour of Asia.

Will has already spent some time in Sydney with Davo and is returning in late June to play the Next Generation Open followed by the NSW Open the following weekend. He is being accompanied by WA's Number 1

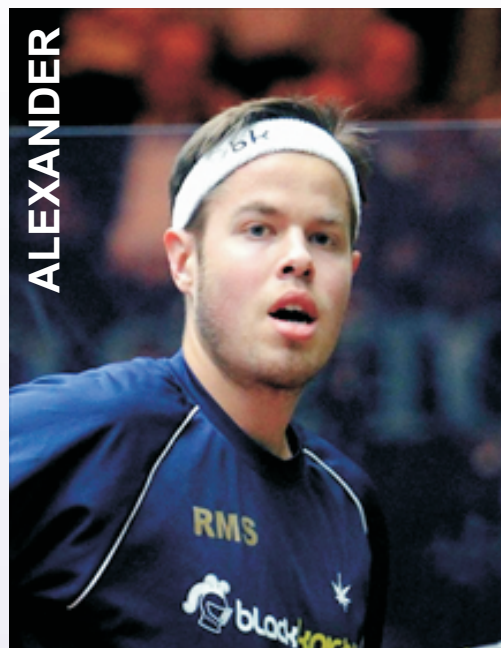


Queenslander **Zac Alexander** has just won the City of Perth WA Open beating last year's semi finalist Lewis Waters.

It was Alexander's 5th PSA title in a row and his 22nd match victory in succession.

Currently ranked 107 in the World Alexander didn't drop a game throughout the tournament in a masterful display of power and accuracy.

Local lads **David Ilich** and **Tim Cornish** reached the Quarter Finals. Ilich fell victim to Alexander whilst Cornish played well against #4 seed Rhys Dowling winning one game in the 43 minute battle.

The final was a see sawing affair with both players giving it their all over the gruelling 65 minute battle.

# MARMION JUNIORS NT TOUR

The Northern Territory Junior Open was held on 30 April 2016 to 1 May 2016 in Darwin.

Seven Marmion juniors travelled to the event and all but 1 junior competed in 2 age groups. Most of the age groups had a round robin format and this resulted in several of the juniors having to play 10 matches over the 2 days! And some of these matches were epic 5-setters!

For the second consecutive year a Marmion junior won the Boys 13s event (2015 Damon Blakey). This year **Oscar Lindsey** was triumphant but the match of that Division was his 5 game semi-final win over No 1 seed Connor Manzie.

Oscar had match ball in the 3rd game only to serve a fault and then lose that game. Oscar eventually wore his opponent down and won the semi-final 11-9, 11-3, 11-13, 7-11, 16-14. Oscar had a comfortable 3-0 win in the final against No 2 seed Lachlan Fox.

Josh's 3rd & 4th Playoff with NT player Chad Blekinsopp saw Josh step up his game and take the No 2 seed player to 5 games. Josh's fitness unfortunately told in the end!

Our girls were consistent in both their 17s and 19s matches. Olivia Lindsey was Runner Up to No 1 seed Jessica Osborne in both events.

In their 17s final, Olivia started nervously but Jessica was too dominate at the 'T' with Olivia losing 9-11, 6-11, 9-11. An hour later the girls then played the 19s final. The score line did not reflect the intensity and quality of squash played in that match. Olivia lost 8-11, 6-11, 11-9, 7-11.

The South West Grand Prix series is a 3 tournament competition, with points allocated at each event, concluding with an overall point winner awarded and celebrated at the final tournament of the series held in Manjimup.

The **Grays Squash South West Junior Classic** signals the beginning of the Grand Prix series, with tournaments to follow in Busselton and Manjimup.

The South West Classic is a fun, one day ability based tournament for all juniors.

It doesn't matter if the junior is just beginning or is at a State level, there's competition for everyone!

The tournament is a bronze ranked

Western Australian tournament and will be held at the South West Sports Centre, in Western Australia's 2nd capital City ... Bunbury.

The South West Sports Centre is owned and operated by the City of Bunbury. The \$12.6 million dollar leisure facility is one of the biggest in Western Australia and outside of Perth.

This is the 2nd year the South West Classic has been held ... and this year for the first time ever, it will be a part of the inaugural South West Grand Prix series!
