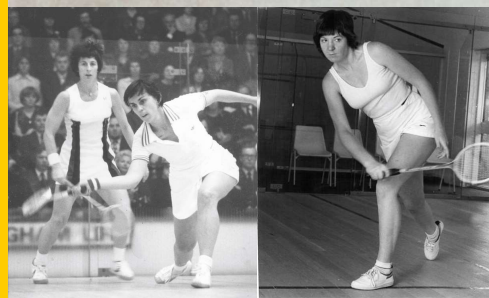

If you've walked into the Cambridge Squash Centre in the last 40 years and you haven't seen Stella Brown behind the counter, there's a good chance you've either had your eyes closed, or perhaps Stella was doing one of the many other jobs that goes with helping to manage a busy squash centre and squash club.

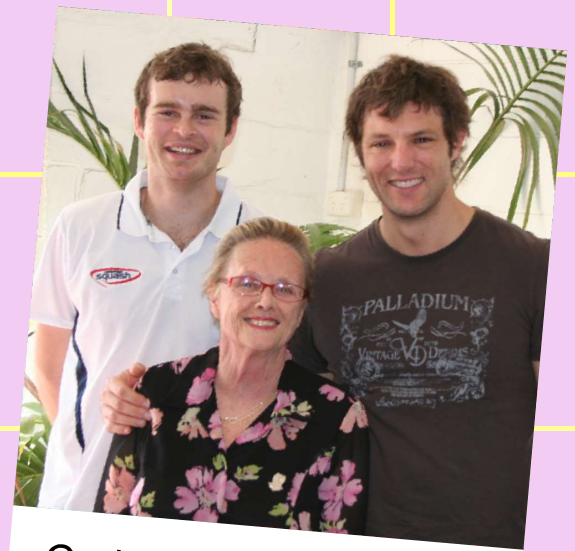
As former world number two squash player Dean Williams put it, "she has been an integral part of the longest running privately owned squash centre in Perth which has a history second to none."

When word got out that Stella would no longer be working at the squash centre, I was flooded with messages from players past & present, some emails coming from half way round the globe. It was a very touching read as well as a fitting testament to the great lady she is.

Words like 'loyalty', 'heart and soul of the club', 'amazing contribution', 'the one constant', 'extraordinary' and 'one of a kind' were all common themes. One former member wrote "It's people like you that make sport in Australia great".

As a former court operator myself, I know how challenging it can be to run a squash centre, however with Stella working tirelessly as my Assistant Manager, I was saved the mental & physical torture of a thousand nervous breakdowns.

Sometimes in business it's the little things that make a big difference and one thing Stella always had plenty of was initiative. If something needed doing she would just do it, no questions asked, even if it meant spending her own money by going down the shop to get supplies that the centre had run out of. No question, no fuss. They just don't make em' like that anymore!

Equally as important, Stella was sharp and had an incredible memory (as well as eyes in the back of her head!) and always knew who had & hadn't paid for court hire, drinks & sweets etc. Member Alex French says he'll never forget those magical words "Alex, you haven't paid yet" from ringing in his ears.

Without any doubt, Stella has saved the centre thousands of

dollars over the years and as another member put it, “probably kept the club going through many lean patches.”

And how about those little blue pennants 'bibles' ... Stella must have cut & pasted thousands over the years, not to mention the famous Club Morning which she ran for seemingly an eternity.

As well as a loyal worker, Stella was also a pretty handy squash player in her day and known for her deadly 'high lofting serve' as well as her volley smash. And even after I forced her to come out of retirement a few years ago she turned a few heads by teaching a couple of our 'upstarts' a thing or two about the game.

And if she wasn't playing, Stella was always offering encouragement as well as great technical advice to players and teammates both on and off the court.

WA Squash Player of the Year Sue Hillier was groomed at Cambridge from a young age and she had this to say about Stella: “Stella taught me the importance of earning your place in the team, and earning the right to move to the next level.”

Amongst her other accolades Stella was awarded for her club work by receiving the prestigious Australian Volunteer of the Year Award. For the record, Stella has been Club Treasurer for an astonishing 42 years (and counting!) as well as fulfilling many other important roles including Women's Captain, Club Secretary and Club President.

Everybody that knows Stella knows she has a heart of gold, she also loves a Bundy & coke or two after a hard day's work! They say that squash is the Healthiest Sport in The World and you only have to look at Stella to see why, she looks as young now as she did 20 years ago!

So what's next for Stella? Fortunately she will remain on the Cambridge Club Committee, I don't know, maybe for another 30 years. One thing however is for certain, Stella Brown's name will be etched forever in the bricks and mortar of Cambridge.
