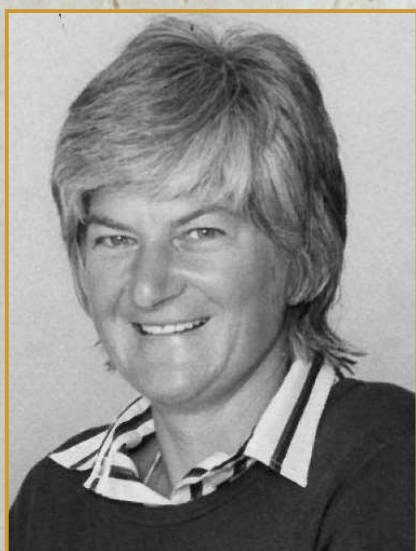

# 2017 AUSTRALIAN MASTERS

The weather was cold and despite glimpses of sun the warmth was definitely not to be found outdoors in Ballarat. The warmth was inside the **Ballarat Squash and Racquetball Centre** starting with the counter staff who were very friendly before moving around the corner to the warm and friendly tournament organisers who were also very efficient.

Hugs and cuddles were flowing on the first day of competition as old friends reacquainted and new friends were welcomed.

WA had 13 players enter the individuals all of whom struggled with the cold conditions on court and returning the lob serves (fortunately the high ceilings enabled some fantastically difficult lob serves to be returned). Shot making seemed to be the requirement to succeed with little chance of getting a long rally happening.

**Joyce Barnett** one of our older members was in the 75-79 Div 2. She struggled in her first match to get used to the conditions, losing to the eventual winner in four: 3/9, 9/4, 2/9, 7/9. If this match had not been played first up perhaps the results may have been different. Joyce went on to win all her other matches comfortably coming a credible runner up in her division.

*"The individual event for me was a disappointment. I didn't play in the Open event which I have been playing for years. Coming 2nd was a bonus - the rest of my games were very easy" said Barnett.*



Joyce's partner Chas Renner was our #1 supporter and driver. He had this to say *"must say the organisation was really good, venue excellent, Committee great. Pity the weather was soooo cold and wet"*.

**George Reid** was in the 65-69 Div 4. Being the #1 seed put enormous pressure on him but he responded in style. Off to a good start with a rest day, George then beat the #3 seed

3/0. He then won his next match in 3 to earn another rest day before his final. In the final, Reid was down 1 game to 2 before sneaking home 10/8 in the fourth to keep everyone on edge. Reid enjoyed a well deserved win: 9/3, 3/9, 8/10, 10/8, 9/7. A great effort!



The Men's 65-69 Div 2 had three WA players competing: **Kelvin Carmichael, Vic Thomas** and **Bob Price**. There were a total of 6 players in the draw. Carmichael had the tough draw losing all his matches, but he always wore a smile! Perhaps taking the long way to get to Ballarat didn't assist his preparation.

Thomas got off to a flying start taking out the #1 seed in three. Doing his best to get his monies worth with several five setters, losing to the #2 in 5. Price took the #1 & #3 seeds to 5 just losing but he won his other two matches to set up a final day clash with Thomas to decide who would take out the runner-up and third places. This match was a tense affair with Price taking the honours 10/8, 9/4, 10/8.



Thomas summed up his experience: *"Terrific courts to play on, a well run event, but bloody cold!"*

**Sue Volzke**, an Australian Masters Team representative was seeded #1 for the 65-70 Womens Open. Sue was not a fan of the cold conditions, which didn't suit her game or help with her arm injury.

Sue won all her matches bar one a tough five setter against the eventual winner Kathy Paterson. This match was hard fought with Sue going down narrowly in the decider: 9/4, 2/9, 9/7, 9/10, 7/9.

**Joe Mihaly** was in the 60-64 Div 3 and seeded #1 in Pool B of his round robin.

After winning all his matches in his pool Mihaly was to play the Australian Team Manager, Garry Irwin who won all his matches in Pool A. Joe played some great squash to be the only player to take a game off Garry, losing his final in 4: 4/9, 9/5, 9/1, 9/3

**Doug Minchin** in the 60-64 Div 2 had some tough games winning two and losing one in his pool. He lost the 3 v 4 playoff in a tough game 1/9, 1/9, 9/3, 6/9 to finish fourth.

Doug was one of the players who had to be very wary when leaving the court through those small doors!

Minchin summed up the whole experience *"VMSA did a great job organising the AMSA champs in Ballarat ... except for the weather ... as it was cold and rainy every day. Heaters, lots of people and renewed friendships did help warm up the centre. Early morning starts were a different story and warming the ball to enable some decent rallies was a problem"*.

*"Congratulations to all the WA Individual winners including Sue Hillier, Anne Richards and George Reid"*.

*"Whilst my own result was to only get fourth, I was just happy to be on court and finish the tournament without further body niggles and to enjoy the camaraderie"*.

**Kevin Smuts** entered the 60-64 Open event and had a tough draw up against a number of rep players. He lost several close matches 8/10 and not much went his way this tournament. Too many ex South Africans to compete against. Kevin was not a fan of the cold conditions.

**Anne Richards**, an Australian Masters Team representative was seeded #1 in the 60-64 Womens Open. Anne went through her pool undefeated to set up a match with Gaye Mitchell the winner of the other pool. Anne was nervous for this match, although no-one knew as she was on a mission and played great squash not letting her opponent in setting herself up for her 10th Australian Title, 9/0, 9/2, 9/0.

Richards reflected on a fortnight of squash *"After the first two tests and before the third test we played the Australian Masters Individual tournament. Again it was freezing, not the sort of conditions we ever experience in Perth! I won my first three matches, with a scratchy game or two trying to cope with the lob, drop, lob drop! The final was against another long time rival Gaye Mitchell from Tasmania and fortunately, I played my best match of the week and had comfortable 3/0 win to give me my 10th Australian Masters Title"*.

**Sue Hillier** was seeded #1 for the 50-54 age group, aiming for her fifth win in a row in this age group. Hillier won all her preliminary matches in three to set up a final with fellow Australian representative Sarah Nelson. Both players were nervous and keen to get some rallies going. This was a hard fought match with Hillier the eventual winner 9/7, 9/5, 2/9, 9/2.

Hillier said: *"The challenge for all of us was the cold. The lob/drop combo worked well for those who could do it. I enjoyed the tournament, meeting old friends and many new ones. The tournament was well organised and ran ahead of time (not a lot of rallies!). I enjoyed watching as many WA players as I could, they all inspire me. No matter what your level, have fun and compete as well as you can. I'm proud of my achievement (five titles in a row). The fifth year was definitely the hardest as the younger ones come into the age group".*

Then to the youngsters:

**Chris Baker** from Broome was in the 45-49 Men's Open and came up against a tough opponent again and again and again. Although not winning a match Chris showed some great skills and had fun playing against his higher ranked opponents – the Australian and NZ team representatives.

His wife **Kirsten Baker** played in the ladies Over 35 Div 2, mixed with ladies in older age groups and despite struggling without the Broome sun, she won her event.

Thankfully, there was more warmth inside the club room (the heater also helped) and the bar definitely helped players celebrate or commiserate each day.

It was a great event, so much fun playing with people who love the game. Well organized albeit playing in freezing conditions.

The individual dinner was a fantastic affair, a great time to celebrate wins and get dressed up. Well done to Joyce who received a plaque for her Goadby award received in 2015.

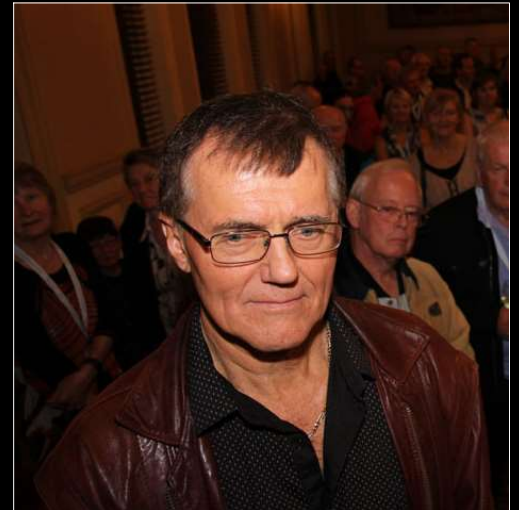

# TRANS TASMAN TEST SERIES

The 2017 Test was held in Ballarat from 1 September. Three ladies from WA were in the Australian Team: **O50 Sue Hillier, O60 Anne Richards, O65 Sue Volzke**. Here is their report on the series.

There were 12 courts at the Ballarat Squash and Racquetball Centre, with three glass backs. The playing conditions would best be described as freezing, we were out of our comfort zone. Our practice hit on the night before our first test match was very quick and didn't require the tracksuits to come off!

The **first test** on Friday 1 September saw us meet some familiar faces in the NZ team and a few new ones, who as usual were immaculately dressed. Peter Wright (OMA) Australian Masters President got the proceedings underway; each manager introduced their team, which was followed by both National Anthems.

Play commenced about 5:30pm with the temperature dropping about 10 degrees, Australia looking bright in our outfits, got off to a great start with two wins by Warren Miller and Melissa Martin, this managed to settle the nerves a little.

Anne was the first WA player on court and although struggling with the lob, drop game played great length to win 11/8, 11/8, 6/11, 11/7. Next was Sue Volzke who fought hard to find her length. She struggled with the cold ball and lost 14/12, 6/11, 5/11, 10/12. Sue Hillier was the last WA player on court and worked hard to hit through the ball and was too quick for her opponent winning 11/9, 11/4, 11/8. Some of the matches could have gone either way with all players playing well. Australia won this test 10 matches to 4.

**Test 2** was on Saturday 2 September and to our delight play commenced at 1pm so warmer conditions (haha what were we thinking).

There was a bigger crowd today with several WA players coming along to cheer for us. Anne, still nervous, was on court first today; she didn't let her opponent in with a sound win 11/9, 13/11, 11/5. Sue Hillier was the next WA on court and won again in straight, 11/5, 11/7, 11/5. Sue Volzke keen to make amends for last night and had a secret weapon (full length skins to keep her warm). Sue fought hard all match, the serves and returns from both players were precise with Sue eventually winning 11/7, 7/11, 6/11, 11/5, 11/8. Fantastic from the oldest age group and inspiration to us all. All matches were much closer than the score indicated with Australia winning this Test 11 matches to 3.

Sunday was a well-earned rest day before the individual championships commence. Our third and final test was after the individuals.

**Test 3** was on Saturday 9 September thankfully at 1pm. Over 100 supporters were there to cheer for the players and watch the great rivalry. Even though we had won the series pride was on the line and everyone wanted to win. After a week of individuals and a chest infection going around, today was going to be tough – and believe it or not it was still cold, two and three layers were being worn prior to play.

Sue Hillier was the third women on court today and the first of the WA ladies. Sue struggled to find her length and strength, her opponent Kathryn played some great volley drops. Sue won 11/8, 8/11, 11/9, 11/5. Anne was the next WA player to go on court, having warmed up well and the added pressure of a surprise visit from her brothers Anne was keen to do well. She came out firing winning the first two games 11/7, 11/7, against Freda. In the third Anne was up 7/2 and went to play a ball off the back wall and crumbled in a heap, her hammy had torn! She was assisted off court, not a great way to end her campaign but looking at it positively was glad it didn't happen yesterday when she won her 10th Australian title. Leaving our best for last Sue Volzke took to the court. Sue was struggling with her injured shoulder and had trouble getting length, Judy her opponent played great squash beating Sue 11/7, 11/13, 11/7, 12/10. This test went down to the wire with Australia winning 8 matches to 6.

Many thanks to Australian Masters Squash, to Garry Irwin our fantastic and efficient Manager. Thanks to the sponsors of the Test, Grays and lastly thanks to WA Masters for their continued support.

**Sue Hillier:** *"It was such a great experience, I have never played in such cold conditions. Wearing two layers plus gloves and a scarf at the center each day was a first for me. The camaraderie of our team members was fantastic and the NZ team are wonderful people and competitors. I was lucky to share accommodation with Anne and Sue (and Sarah from NSW). Even though we are from the same State I have never stayed with them, it was a relaxed and positive household. Albeit competitive card players, I would walk 500 miles to do it all again with them".*

**Anne Richards:** *"Looking back it was a very comprehensive 3 tests to nil win by Australia over NZ in the 2017 Trans Tasman but it never felt easy. The unusually freezing cold conditions at all tests was a bit of an equaliser which you would think the Kiwis would relish but the Aussies really stepped up and were the better team. We were kitted out in our new bright green and yellow uniforms ... you couldn't miss us! It was great to have three WA girls in the team Sue Volzke, myself and Sue Hillier. We had great Aussie team spirit going and plenty of support and advice on hand during our matches. On a personal note I won the first two tests against long time Kiwi rival Freda Walker and was two games up and well into winning the third when I tore my hamstring and made a dramatic exit. Fortunately, we had already won the series. Apart from the win the standout for me was the great camaraderie between the teams, the renewal of friendships and the fun we all had".*

**Sue Volzke:** *"As the matriarch of the group and arguably the one who has represented Australia more often than any of my colleagues, time has taken its toll. My shoulder proved a formidable handicap but I'm pleased to say didn't prevent me from creating plenty of resistance! A warm weather player, the cold conditions provided an excellent opportunity to learn from my wonderful team members how to adapt. Three amazing ladies who excelled at their game and coaching each other to victory or reluctant submission! The company of all the players was second to none and I'm so grateful to have been part of it".*

# @ daytime delights D

## Raelene Marriott Reports

Currently, the Wednesday Day League is in a mid season break for 5 weeks for school holidays and many of our players have also attended the Masters in Victoria. It has also been a great opportunity for a few players to go on holidays and for some to recover from those pesky injuries.

A famous part of the Wednesday Day League is our wonderful, very enjoyable and sociable lunches after each day's matches. One popular sweet is our **Vanilla Slices** ... so here is the recipe.



### Vanilla Slices

2 x 200g packets Arnott's Lattice biscuits

1 cup milk

2 cups thickened cream

½ cup cornflour

1/3 custard powder

¾ cup caster sugar

2 egg yolks

2 tsps vanilla essence

Passionfruit icing

¼ cup passionfruit pulp

2 ¾ cups icing sugar

1. Grease a 19cm x 30cm lamington pan (I use grease proof paper). Line base with half the biscuits, trimming to fit.

2. Place milk and cream in a medium saucepan. Bring to boil. Remove from heat.

3. Combine cornflour, custard powder and sugar in a heatproof medium saucepan. Slowly whisk in hot milk mixture.

4. Cook, whisking over a medium heat, for about 5 minutes, or until boiling and thickened slightly. Stir in yolks and essence. Spread over biscuits in pan. Top with remaining biscuits. Refrigerate overnight or until set.

5. To make the passionfruit icing, combine both ingredients in a bowl. Stir until smooth.

6. Spread icing evenly over the top of the slice and refrigerate until icing is set.

7. Once set, cut slice into squares and serve.

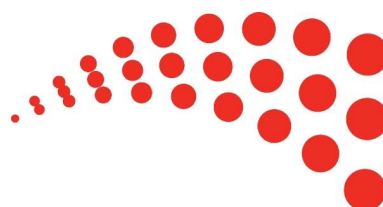

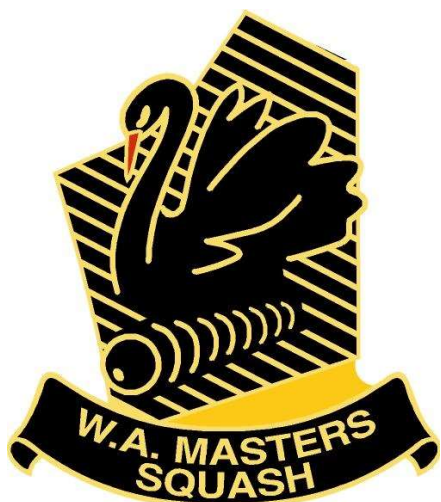
