2017 Inductee **Helen Muir**

8th November 2017 **WA Squash Hall of Fame Dinner** Royal Perth Golf Course

The evening started with emcee, Anne Richards introducing WA Squash President, Steve Bowen who had a few words to say and welcomed all the Life Members and Hall of Fame Members in attendance.

The third WA Squash Hall of Fame Gala Dinner was a great night! With around 130 guests at the warm venue there were many reunions, lots of memories and waves of laughter throughout the evening.

Steve awarded **Helen Muir** with the **Hall of Fame Membership**, then Anne asked her how her career in squash started. Helen responded "I was in the Australian Junior Tennis Squad with Margaret Court and travelled to Melbourne to further my tennis career. Whilst working at the local squash courts I decided to practice my tennis shots on the squash court and was subsequently approached to play squash".

Homesick Helen returned to Perth in 1960 and played at the Adelphi Club. She was selected in the WA State team in 1962, winning her first of five State Opens in 1963. Helen represented Australia in 1964 against Great Britain and played in the British Open.

Helen often came up against the world famous Heather McKay in the semi finals of the Australian Open. Helen said "playing Heather was always tough, she is an awesome athlete. We would see who could take the most points off her. The most I got was 4!"

Helen was regularly seeded in the top 8 in Australia. Perhaps without Heather an Australian title was possible. Helen outlined that "squash was run by families (Cambridge, Canning Bridge, Broadway) and was always friendly but we played hard. And the suppers well, they went on and on".

Helen went to Kalgoorlie in 1968 where she helped start the Golden Open Squash Tournament that is still running today.

Helen recently returned from the World Masters Tennis in the USA where she has a world ITF ranking of 18 in the O75.

So many of Helen's friends were there to celebrate with her, including a table from the Kalgoorlie days. With all these memories perhaps she will start playing again.



Also acknowledged at the dinner was **Lyn Chandler** who was presented with the **Service to WA Squash Award**.

Lyn started playing squash at Belmont Squashworks in 1983. In 1985 she joined the committee and has been on the Belmont committee since then, apart from a one-year absence. Lyn has served on most of the WA Squash committees and is still heavily involved running the Monday night and Day league competitions.

Lyn said "My Dad was a great mentor and always said to help out and get involved" Asked about her motivation she said "I enjoy it, you make so many friends and they appreciate the work I do. It's rewarding, I love squash and will keep plugging away". Lyn works tirelessly for the sport and is worthy recipient of this award.

Sue Hillier from Vic Park Squash Club was awarded the **2017 Player of the Year**.

Sue has had an outstanding year starting with a win in the World Masters Games O50 in April. She then went on to play in the final of the WA Open hoping for her 8th win, only to lose in 4.

In July, Sue won the Golden Open Div 1 and Masters event. She then went on to win the WA State Masters O50 title. Sue represented Australia in the Masters Trans Tasman Team in September winning all her matches in the test series.



Sue then won her fifth Australian O50 Championship in Ballarat to become only the 8th player to achieve 5 wins in an age group since the competition began.

Sue has ended the year as the #1 female player in WA ... an incredible achievement for the 54 year old. Agreeing that mobility was a key factor in the masters she was asked how she stays mobile "I'm lucky enough to hit with my son Jack, even though he says I'm slow and I do circuit training with my daughter Meg". Asked what her

2017 Spring Masters Teams Tournament

This year, we had 63 entrants, not our biggest but considering that quite a few "usuals" were unable to enter for various reasons, the numbers were very pleasing.

We were therefore able to run with 5 divisions of four teams with 3 players in each team.

We ran our usual format of commencing at 1pm on Saturday with one match played and continuing on Sunday from 10am with a further two matches, all consisting of 3 games played with traditional "hand in hand out" scoring. The point a rally scoring system is being considered for next year.

Quite a number of entrants were not only new to Masters but had never played either pennants or a tournament in WA. This made putting fair divisions together rather difficult, as we had no player history to rely on. Five actual teams were entered, with the remaining being individual entries. In some cases the teams were difficult to place due to the varied abilities of the three players.

This year we had a very strong team from Bunbury in Division 1 and a Busselton team in Division 2. Both of which were undefeated.

The tournament ran very smoothly. The atmosphere throughout was tremendous. The Squash Factory provided an excellent venue, with players and spectators able to watch great matches while eating, drinking and socialising. The canteen, run by Sue Cowell, provided excellent food and the nibbles were enjoyed by all.

We had two raffles running, one to raise funds for the juniors, and the other for Masters. Both, thanks to the generosity of Masters Players, were well supported.

As usual thanks must go to the help and assistance from the Masters Committee members and other volunteers and also to Brian Roby who was a great help with the Autodraw. The friendly enjoyable atmosphere each year makes this one of the easiest tournaments to organise and run.

The Masters AGM was held after play on the Saturday which proved again to be very successful. This was followed by Webber cooked beef and turkey rolls, the aroma of which permeated through the centre throughout the afternoon.

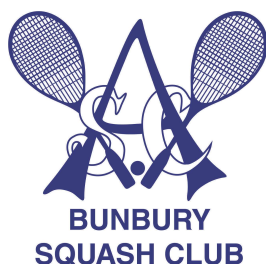
