NEW TEAM CHAMPIONS



Our WA Juniors have pulled off a remarkable victory over the Queensland Sharks to win the Combined Team Title at the 2018 Australian Junior Team Championships for the very first time in the event's history. Queensland has dominated the past 14 championships creating a record that will be hard to beat. NSW had won 11 in a row before that.

Finally, after so many years of trying and a number of runner up performances you have won the toughest team title in squash.

Many people don't appreciate just what it takes to win this title. Firstly, the biggest challenge facing any team is putting your best team forward against your closest rivals for each clash.

Keeping everyone fit and motivated for 4 days is difficult enough. Then to consistently perform (playing and coaching) across 4 age groups from U13 to U19 requires both extracting strong performances against the odds and helping players to keep their nerve in pressure situations.

A maximum 16 players (4 age groups of 4 players) play in each tie. A team of 24 players participate with coaches determining their best team for each of the round robin contests between all states/territories.

Whilst the coaches of the 2019 side have done a fabulous job one man needs to be recognised and remembered for his drive and determination to better position WA to potentially win the title.

That man is **Mike Cornish**. He recognised what Queensland was doing and then

For many juniors across the nation, the Australian Junior Championships is the pinnacle of junior squash and provides an opportunity for each state's best juniors to face off against each other. This year, 30 juniors travelled to Darwin for the individual championships to represent Western Australia. Hosted at the 12 court Marrara Squash Centre, the individual tournament began on Saturday the 28th of September and lasted four days.

The WA State Junior Team left for Darwin on the Thursday the 26th of September and consisted of 24 juniors across 8 age groups. Upon our afternoon arrival, we were treated to the heat of the tropics and blessed with air conditioned accommodation and a swimming pool. Our first day provided juniors a chance to relax, bond with teammates and acclimatise to the different conditions. The following day, the team met with other West Australian players at the courts for a light training session to adjust to the bouncier courts.

The first two days of competition showcased excellent squash across all age groups as players fought for spots in Sunday afternoon's quarter finals. By Monday, 8 WA juniors had successfully made it even further to appear in the semi-finals, which is a huge achievement and something that they would all be very proud of.

Congratulations to Eric Marsh (U11) who won his first title by winning the final in 5 games. Also well done to Isla Harris who made her first AJC final in the U13 girls after beating the South Australian 3rd seed in straight games. Although she didn't quite get over the line in the final (2-3), this is an outstanding achievement for Isla, who still has another year in this age group.

The U15 boys also did our state incredibly proud, with WA boasting 3 out of 4 boys in the semi-finals and an all-West Aussie final between Greg Chan and Oscar Curtis, which saw Greg take home the trophy 3 games to 2 in a final that showcased tremendous sportsmanship and prolific, entertaining squash.

The final day also saw Erin Classen (U15) and Daniel Marsh (U13) win their final matches to place 3rd. Tuesday concluded with the presentation dinner at TIO Stadium where we celebrated the individual achievements of our 6 juniors who placed on the podium.

A much needed day off on Wednesday was well spent on the Darwin waterfront, where the kids just relaxed, swam in the wave pool and did some shopping. Later in the afternoon, juniors prepared for the annual team cook off - an event which always seems to bring out the best and worst of us all.

On Thursday, the team event commenced with a tough morning match up for WA as we faced New South Wales. It was great to see some of our juniors in WA colours for their first time and even better to see us win 3-1 relatively comfortably. The afternoon match up provided a rest for all but 4 of our players as we faced Northern Territory, who've just returned to the competition after many years. This was a positive step even if they only managed to put together an U17's age group. Hopefully, they're encouraged to continue to participate in the years to come.

Day 2 of the Team Event was set to be our most comfortable as we faced South Australia in the morning and ACT in the afternoon. Although South Australia weren't as strong as previous years, they were nonetheless a respectable team to compete against and fought hard. Fortunately, WA won this tie 4-0 and moved onto our afternoon match-up with ACT.

Despite not fielding a complete team, ACT have some excellent players so the day wasn't easy for everyone. A special mention goes out to Greg Chan (U15), who was playing up in the U17's and defeated the Australian #1 - Sam Sergo in 5. WA also won

this tie 4-0 and ended the day relatively early to give us time for relax and prepare for some big matches on Saturday.

Day 3 saw us play Tasmania in the morning, who entertained us all with a terrific team chant and definitely inspired us to up our game in that department for future years. Although there were some tough matches in the under 19's, an incomplete team allowed us to win comfortably 3-1 and focus on our afternoon battle with Victoria.

By this stage, the competition was a 3-horse race and Victoria made it very clear of their desire to knock us off. Our rivalry with Victoria continued as plenty of banter went back and forth behind the glass. However, it was our juniors who continued their run by displaying some outstanding squash to somewhat surprisingly take it home 4-0. To top it off, it was very humbling to hear such kind words from Victorian coach Vicki Cardwell, who highlighted our team's positive attitude and sportsmanship as a key reason behind our success.

The final day saw a grand final showdown against Queensland - a team which boasts 14 consecutive titles. In a tie which started at 9am and didn't finish until almost 2pm, the matches had everyone on the edge of their seats as no one knew which way it would go right until the final match.

As a coach I was incredibly proud of how our players conducted themselves on court as they continued to show a positive attitude which saw them always give 100% regardless of the score. I'm convinced it was such a mentality which saw many of our juniors play their best ever matches for the team.

After such a long time, we were overjoyed to beat Queensland and lift the trophy after drawing 2-2 on age groups and winning 10 matches to 6. This was a fantastic result for WA and is a reward for all the hard work that our players, coaches and volunteers throughout the whole state have put in for many years.

I would like to take this opportunity to personally thank Sue Hillier, Elspeth Diack, Andrew Pratt and all the juniors for making this trip such an enjoyable and memorable experience.
