## **RESIDENT'S REPORT**



### **Terrace Squash**

The first priority in 2018 was to resolve WA Squash's home at The Terrace Squash Center. Due to our subtenant vacating, and not having approval by our landlord to replace the subtenant this placed significant financial stress on WA Squash.

Several options were discussed with the landlord, and this resulted in a break lease being negotiated where both parties agreed for WA Squash to vacate by the end of 2018.

This in the Boards view was a good outcome that enabled WA Squash to stop the cash flow loss of staying in this facility.

WA Squash are now based at 15/ 386 Wanneroo Road, Westminister

### **State Junior Team**

Our juniors won the Australian Junior Championships for the first time.

This result reflects a significant achievement due to the result of many years of hard work from our Coaches, Coordinators and Development officer. Proudly, it was noted the True Sport values were reflected in our junior's behaviors, which is a credit to the players, parents and administrators.

### **Facilities**

Facilities working group has been established to work with the State Government on a business case for a State Centre.

The scope and potential locations for a State Centre are still being worked through.

The business case will help guide any future investment decision.

We are hopeful the business case will be finalised in the coming months.

This has been a monumental effort by the working group, and would like to thank them for their efforts.

### **Communication**

WA Squash will continue to seek improvement on its communication to members.

Currently we are using Facebook, WA Squash Website and The Swan monthly newsletter as our media mediums.

Several member forums were held during 2018, this purpose of these forums is to provide a platform for open communication with out membership base.

This will continue in 2019 and evolve as required.

### **WA Squash Staff:**

Don Huffer has resigned as CEO of WA Squash as of the end January 2019.

For the many people who have worked with Don you will know Don's burning passion for Squash, he has contributed tirelessly for many years and on behalf of the WA Squash Board and the Squash community I would like to thank him for his contribution.



Dean Williams has stepped in as the caretaker General Manager; Dean comes with a plethora of experience in Squash both as a player and sports administrator. WA Squash are very fortunate to have the services of Dean.

Sue Hillier continues as WA Squash's Development officer, as does Leonie Cole as our financial controller.

All of our staff work with a limited amount of resources and I would like to thank them for their contribution, which far exceeds their remuneration.

### **Sporty HQ**

Squash Australia have decided to stop using the matrix and change to Sporty HQ. This is a monumental task in itself, and has placed a huge amount of pressure on WA Squash staff and volunteers.

I would like to thank our members for their patience, this change over would have not happened without Deans and Dons tireless efforts.

### **New Constitution**

WA Squash will be operating under a new Constitution in the near future; I encourage all of our members to allocate time to review and comment on this document.

It is mandatory that our constitution be amended so it reflects the current statutory requirements.

### **Squash Australia**

WA Squash seek to continually improve our communication with Squash Australia.

In a federated model, the National body is there to support its members (the states), just as WA Squash is here to support its members (the clubs)

WA Squash will be clearly communicating with Squash Australia on what WA Squash need to assist in servicing our Clubs.

It is easy for too much time, effort and energy to be allocated on Squash Australia matters.

Our limited resources and time should always be focused on assisting our clubs and developing squash in WA.

### **Operational Plan**

Moving forward WA Squash will be working through a comprehensive Operational plan, this plan is a road map to identify all the areas of WA Squash operations and who is managing the delivery.

Volunteers play such a significant role in delivering key services to our membership base; as such we will be seeking out volunteers to assist in working groups and sub committees.

In time, the CEO and Development officers role will evolve to assist managing the committee's and working groups so we are all driving towards servicing the members better.

This year a Facilities working group and Coaching Committee have been established, work is currently underway on forming a pennant and tournament committee.

If you love Squash and have something to contribute we would value hearing from you.

## **GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT**

2018 was a difficult year for WA Squash with various situations placing pressure on our financial situation. Our end result was an operating loss of \$20,810.

Throughout the year we operated under the constant threat that the Singaporean based owners of the Hyatt complex would force us out of home base despite having seven years to run on our lease. Our initial response was for WA Squash to return to running Terrace Squash Centre to maximize our income situation in the short term.

Eventually we had no option but to move out of our Hyatt home after we were denied permission to retain a sub-tenant. Foreign investment with a ruthless quest for profit can have a negative impact on the social fabric of an area and in this case Squash and other interactive activities around East Perth have been severely impacted.

There was further concern when the tenants at our investment property decided to downsize and with less offices being utilized income was reduced. The obvious outcome was to consider moving WA Squash operations to the vacant investment property offices. Ultimately it was decided to pursue such option from the start of the 2019 year.

Our relationship with Squash Australia continues to be strained as they are providing no support in the promotion of the sport in this State. We are finding it increasingly more difficult to justify the Affiliation fee that we are required to pay. There is also considerable frustration with the process of updating coaching accreditations.

Late in the year Squash Australia advised that they were shutting down Matrix and insisted that from the start of 2019 we would have to utilize SportyHQ to run our Pennant and Tournament competitions. This presents some difficulty as we have not been provided with operating instructions and it appears as if trials in other States have identified several problems with the system.

On a positive note Western Australia won the Overall State Teams event at the 2018 Australian Junior Age Squash Championships. This was our first such victory since the inception of the event in 1984 and broke a run of 14 years by Queensland. Greg Chan (Under 15 Boys) and Eric Marsh (Under 11 Boys) also won their individual events.

I very much appreciate the commitment of staff members Leonie Cole (Accounts), Sue Hillier (Metropolitan Development) and Mike Cornish (Country Development) who have continued to work diligently during what has been a difficult period.

During the year there was a major change at Board level with Stephen Bowen not being re-elected and subsequently Glenn Hitch being appointed to fill the President role. I would personally like to thank Steve for his contribution to Squash over many years and for the support he has provided over my period with WA Squash.

We are very appreciative of the financial assistance provided by the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries and by Heathway. They are both key players in ensuring the ongoing relevance of our sport.

Finally as my last General Manager's report, I would like to express sincere thanks to everyone who has helped me over the past fourteen years and indeed to anyone with a passion for Squash. You are the ultimate drivers of the sport in Western Australia

## **DEVELOPMENT REPORT**

### **D.L.G.S & C.I. Organisational Sustainability Funding**

Fundamental to the workings of WA Squash is the \$65,000 yearly Organisational Sustainability Funding we receive from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries. The D.L.G.S & C.I. also provide a great deal of additional assistance in various aspects of our operations. During the year they have been of considerable assistance in helping WA Squash address our long term premises situation.

### **Healthway Health Promotion Funding**

During 2018 we were again able to secure \$35,000 sponsorship from Healthway to promote the Smarter than Smoking message to as many squash participants as possible. Largely through the efforts of Mike Cornish we were able to reach over 10,000 students through our school programs (Just-Squash It, Mini Squash and Inflatable Courts) as well as conducting country development programs at Goldfields, Great Southern, Kimberley, Pilbara, South West and Wheatbelt regions as well as in the Metropolitan area.

### **Volunteers**

WA Squash relies heavily on a large contingent of volunteers who provide support at the various stages of our programs. We are very appreciative of such involvement and encourage our Clubs to give recognition to all of those people who assist in any way.

### **Sub-Committees**

Our various sub-committees play a major role in assessing and controlling various elements of our sport through a more specific approach to their various field of interest. We thank all those people who make the time and effort to be involved.

### **Coaches**

We are very appreciative of the coaches who are able to conduct various development sessions throughout the State. Such sessions are vital in instilling a desire for a participant to become more involved in the squash and help to ensure the future of the sport in this State.

### **Members**

WA Squash is a representative body of the various affiliated Squash Clubs throughout the State of Western Australia (40 such Clubs at present). These member clubs together with Squash court owners and operators are the driving forces behind our sport.

**Notes to the Financial Statements  
For the year ended 31 December 2018**

**Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act . The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

**(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

**(b) Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

**(c) Employee Benefits**

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

**(d) Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reasonably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

**(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

**(f) Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

**Notes to the Financial Statements**

**For the year ended 31 December 2018**

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

**(g) Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

**(h) Trade and Other Payables**

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

**Independent Auditor's Report**


Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of this financial report.

As part of an audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards, we exercise professional judgement and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the association's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the committee.
