He woke up during the third game and left, the next time we saw him was at the Monte Carlo Country Club where he presented the beautiful trophy to me. He whispered to me he was sorry he fell asleep and said that he had been travelling and was jet lagged. I was lucky to win the title on 2 more occasions but he never came back!

THE MICHAELA PRATT REPORT



Once again, the WA Smarter than Smoking State Junior Titles were held in conjunction with the Mirrabooka Classic Open on the first couple of days of the school holidays.

With a combination of two draws, numerous divisions and junior age events coupled with many players entering two or even three events it was a logistical challenge to keep all players happy with breaks between games and balanced refereeing/marketing duties.

The last of poor Kane's hair fell out however, with the unperturbable Luke assisting, the draw ran super smoothly. I think they were both Rubik's cube nerds in their younger days!

Pam and Neil had a much easier job with their let/stroke decisions, showcasing the high levels of sportsmanship displayed. Some parents and members of the State Junior Squad ran a fundraiser to help send the State Junior team to Singapore later in the year.

In the 'How Far Will You Go for Squash' competition, the Baker family, who travelled all the way from Broome were the main contenders, until several Victorian players travelled the distance to come and support our State title event.

Also, great to see a couple of Exmouth players down for the holidays - the Nunn and Tsangaris families. They were certainly all shook up upon returning, if you will pardon the earthquake pun.

Junior Results

It was great to see so many juniors playing the u11 boys' event, with 11 boys playing for positions and several new faces. Bluegums Speedy Sterling Slyth who defeated the No 1 seed in the semi beat Marmion's Will Rawling in the final.

The u11 and u13 girls' event was combined to allow for a bigger tournament and more matches for the girls. The top three u11 girls' results were all tied, so the results from the State Junior Team event were used to determine final positions.

In the u13 girls, Isla Harris (Moora) and Hannah Slyth (Bluegum) were very well-matched in their quality final, with Isla narrowly winning 11-9 in the fifth. In the u13 boys, Victorian player, Darcy Hayes defeated Maddington/Gosnells Eric Marsh.

The u15 girls saw Isla Harris (Moora) being too strong for a weary Caitlin Pratt (Narrogin), winning in three. It was the older brother's chance to dance in the u15 boys final with Connor Hayes (Victoria) defeating Daniel Marsh in 5, in another close final.

Erin Classen took home both the u17 and u19 titles against Michaela Pratt and Pascale Louka.

Not wanting to be outshone by his sister, Dylan Classen won the u17 title, against Oscar Lindsey and came runner up to Abel Jin in the u19's.

The huge news was Erin, along with Abel Jin and Greg Chan being selected to play in the

In Division 1, Michelle Hodge and Leigh Barnes had another tight affair playing a wicked final, with Michelle winning in five. In Division 2, Marisa Schönwolf was crowned the victor, with Denise Christie a close second.

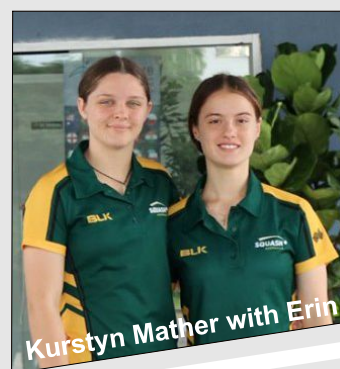

Oscar



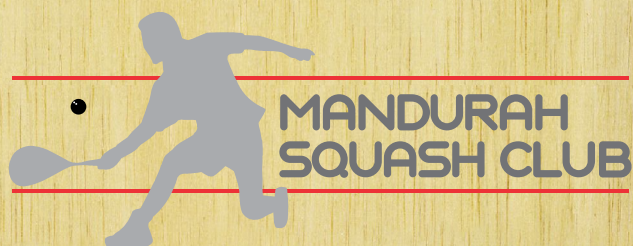

The action shots below are from his quarter final against the #2 seed Harith Danial B Jefri from Malaysia which Oscar lost in 5 (11-6, 8-11, 2-11, 11-7, 7-11).



In Hong Kong the U15 boys were very strong with 5 Egyptians in the top 8 seeds. Oscar lost his 3rd match but played on and won the Special Plate, which means a 9th place finish. The icing on the cake was a win against a 5/8 seeded Egyptian!

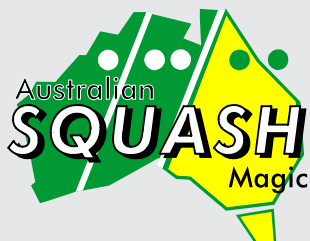

Services to Masters Award

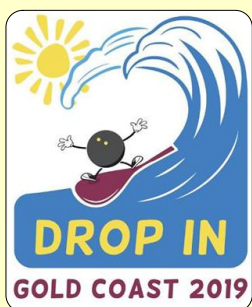

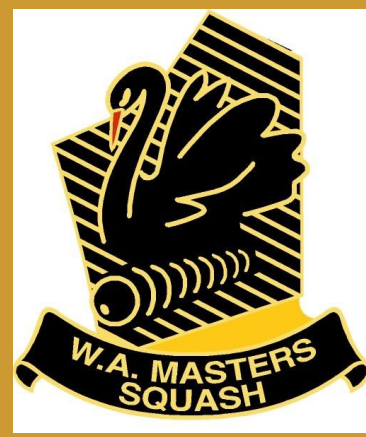
Spotlight on 2019 WA Masters Squash Committee – Sharon Gilgallon



While Sharon has played predominantly for south of the river clubs, she has contributed greatly to squash generally during her years in the sport. Serving on various club and Masters committees has made Sharon a very well known Masters member.

Sharon, a teacher, began her teaching career in 1970 at Boddington District High School and, after only a handful of years off while having and looking after her son and daughter, she finally retired from her profession this year on 19 July. Sharon taught at a variety of country and metro schools during her time with the Department of Education, ending her last few years with them in the extremely demanding role of Workplace Learning Coordinator at Sevenoaks Senior College.

Sharon began her squash career in 1978 at Kalamunda squash centre where she joined the Day League. At that time there were around thirty-odd

teams; the popularity of the sport was at its peak in those days. While continuing to play Day Pennants for seven years, Sharon then joined the Night Pennant competition in 1982. Sharon continued to play for Kalamunda for many years, and in fact held the post of Club Captain for 18 years. After a move to Como in 1998 Sharon joined Manning Squash Club and took on the job of Ladies Club Captain and served for four years in the role. During that time Manning became Como and unfortunately finally closed. Not to be daunted in her pursuit of playing squash, Sharon then joined Kensington where she is currently Club Secretary, and has held this post for the past seven or eight years. She is currently playing the Tuesday night pennant competition.

Some of Sharon's happiest and fulfilling squash times have come from playing in a pennant team for many years with Joan Dreghorn. Along with many Masters players, Sharon, has drawn great inspiration from Joan, who was winning WA Masters State Championships in the 80+ age group as recently as 2017.

As well as her love of squash, Sharon is also a keen golfer, playing with Collier Pines Ladies Club. Unfortunately, this precludes her from returning to Day League, but she has wholeheartedly thrown herself into WA Masters Squash, joining the committee and taking on the challenging role of Merchandise Manager, or as Sharon describes the role, 'Chief hauler of boxes and shirts to tournaments' (which totally understates the multifarious tasks it involves). Nevertheless, Sharon will be happy to continue serving on the committee, in her words, 'as long as she's wanted'.

In her 'spare time' Sharon has embarked on many overseas holidays, travelling all over the world. While she has thoroughly enjoyed all her overseas experiences, she does, however, have especially fond memories of her time in Cinque Terre, where she enjoyed a 'remarkable' time with Ivo the waiter. For this we need to employ our imagination as she refused to spill any more beans on the subject. *Italy is such a romantic country!*

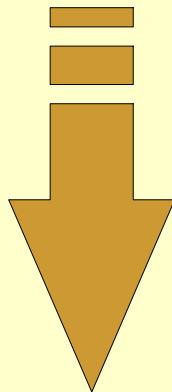

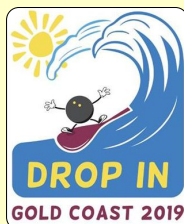
