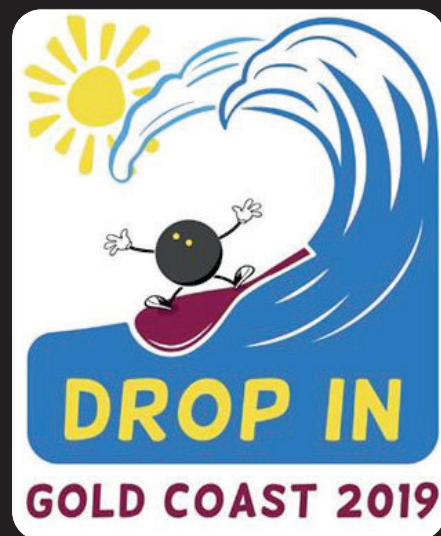

DEAN'S DIARY



Not much to report on this month as I have been away for the whole of September in Ireland and the UK.

I caught up with an old Australian Team mate in Ricki Hill (we played in the world teams titles in 1983 in NZ). He is now a Captain with Virgin Airlines for the last 25 years and lives in Dublin so we were able to taste the odd Guinness and talk about old times .

Also on the trip, a great friend in Jonny Leslie from England organised a reunion where past players from World Championships gathered and it was a great day. Gawain Briars and Phil Kenyon represented England many times and I played both of them many times over about a 6 year span.

Gawain is a lawyer and was the lawyer for PSA for 8 years based in Cardiff. Phil Kenyon played quite late into his late thirties before doing a bit of coaching and then retired to a nice life of surfing in Spain. Ian Robinson was there as well and we had many battles over the years but most importantly he helped us Aussies with accommodation in London in the mid seventies and with training venues in and around London.

Jonny Leslie was the last winner of the British Amateur Championships in 1979 as the game went "open" in 1980. He went on to work with Rio Tinto out of London as a CEO of a portfolio for 26 years. He was also the Captain of the team that won the 1979 World Team Titles in Brisbane. The World team titles followed the World individual titles which were held in Melbourne where we saw for the first time a young 15yo called Jahangir Khan take the title by beating Phil Kenyon in the final.

So one of my points in this issue is that whilst some people think that squash is not a huge professional sport in money terms, one of the priceless things that we all had was a great friendship off the court. The matches we played against each other were fierce and sometimes really ugly but every time after the match we had a drink together and formed friendships for life which are priceless. Sadly, this seems to be something that has disappeared.

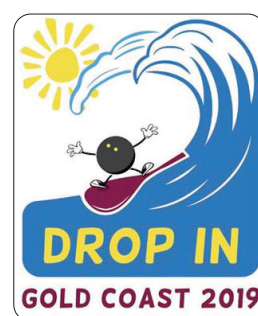

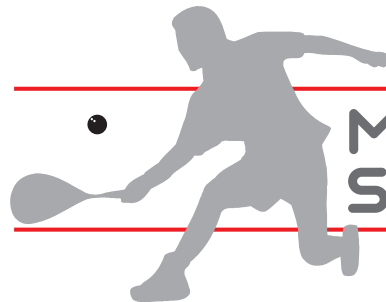

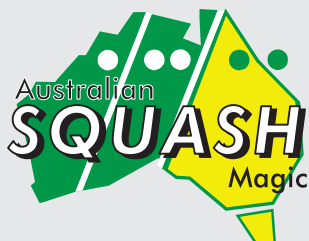

Tim Cowell's **Cambridge Junior Teams Challenge**

The inspiration for putting this event on goes back to around State Titles time, in particular the zone teams event. A little bit of chatter here and there about the format, a few discussions with some of the older juniors or recently aged out and the clear thing that stood out is that we seemed to lack the opportunity to represent your club on a regular basis. That plus playing with friends and club mates appealed more to some players than just playing an individual tournament.

So things were put in motion, we got some interest and then bang, and slowly but surely, junior coordinators from across the state started to submit their teams. By the time closing date arrived, we had 21 teams - 63 players to contest our event. To date, the only other junior event in WA bigger this year was the State Junior Age Championships. It certainly blew our expectations out of the court! The most pleasing thing was the number of brand new juniors to tournament. Not far off 50% in fact were playing their first ever tournament!

The format was simple, teams of 3, a set playing order, round robin divisions and a scoring system based on our pennant system, we were under way. A few technical issues with SportyHQ meant the backup spreadsheets to enter team results in was play. (Work in progress for the next one) The start of play had to be brought forward to 8.30am for us to fit all the matches into one day. And of course round 1 sees a couple of 5 game epics in division 1 which had us running well behind for the next few hours! Dylan Classen upset Remi Young in 5, getting to a 2-0 lead before Remi pegged it back, whilst Jackson Kiely and Ethan Baldwin-Wright had a monster on the other court with Jackson getting up 11-7 in the 5th.

Division 4 was great to see, where the majority of players were in their first ever tournament. Matches alternated between blue dot and single yellow balls, with some great rallies from our next generation of players. Div 4 saw 5 teams with all matches set to play 3 games. Even a few of the serves were considered ok if close enough! Still it was especially really pleasing to see a number of these juniors take the jump into playing a tournament. Marmion 6 were far too strong though

Division 2 saw a dominant Maddington/Gosnells take out the division winning all 3 fixtures. Young River Kiely got his money's worth with back to back 5 setters to start the day off! 2nd place was interesting with Marmion 2, 3 and Blue Gum 1 all winning one tie each, however it was Marmion 2 who had the most points on 36 to finish in 2nd.

Fast forward to the end of the day and a couple of our final play offs came right down to the wire. In fitting fashion, Div 3 saw the final between Marmion 4 and Vicmont (Merged team of Belmont and Vic Park) Will Rawling got Marmion off to a strong start however it was the depth of Vicmont which got them over the line winning 2 matches to 1.

Division 1 also followed suit but took it one step further not only down to the last

match, but the last game as well. Stephan 'The Machine' Weyers got off to a strong start against Daniel Marsh taking the first 11-3, however Daniel pegged it right back to take the next two 11-8 11-6.
