With the very busy month of September behind us we now turn our attention to the 'soft' opening of the newly formed WA Squash Academy (WASA) on Sunday the 11th of October at the Belmont Squash Centre.

This exciting venture has been made possible with private funds through the Australian Sports Foundation where people can donate money to a worthwhile cause such as this one and receive a tax benefit in the process. A huge thank you to Jonathan Cook who has instigated the funds which will keep flowing into the future. WA Squash and I would love to see many people donate to this fund so as to keep this wonderful initiative going.

The main aim is to keep players playing well after juniors so this is not a junior program, it is open to all ages over 15. It will be fun, as well as a learning platform to broaden the players depth of knowledge and of course hopefully improve their squash and to reach whatever goal they may set.

With the help of the committee (Ken Watson and Glenn Hitch) it is at this stage the aim to meet fortnightly and to experience a variety of training methods and to forge a culture in WA squash which will last a very long time.

The venue is significant as Belmont is the only remaining centre in WA to have hosted the very prestigious Australian Championships in 1973. These carnivals were the pinnacle of squash and players trained so hard to represent their state and be a part of the greatest 2 weeks of squash you could imagine. Dreams were made, lifelong friendships were made and Australia was the envy of the World as it produced so many champions due to these carnivals. There is nothing better than interstate rivalry and if Australia is to ever be a force again this must be re-instated.

In 1973 not only was the Australian Amateur titles held but at the same time the Australian Professional Titles were held. Heather McKay won her 14th consecutive title here (and her last one before turning pro) and we saw Cam Nancarrow lose his title to a young Qamar Zaman in the Men's final 3/2.

Geoff Hunt won the professional title beating Ken Hiscoe. Mark Mounsey (Vic) won the junior boys and Rhonda Shapland (winner in 1972) lost to Sue Heaney in an upset as Rhonda went on to win 3 more Australian titles after that and holds the record of 4 Australian Junior titles. She of course went on to win the 1981 World Women's Title held in

“The Warm Up”

This is the first article in what we hope will be a regular contribution to THE SWAN.

It is intended to be a forum where you will be able to ask for clarification on the rules of the sport and also to promote discussion between Referees, Coaches and players.

As a starting point we will start off with the **Warm Up**.

Recently there has been a lot of complaints regarding what is considered a fair warm-up or rather what is an unfair warm-up.

The first part of the Warm-Up rules states:

- “At the start of the match the players go on court together to **warm up the ball for a maximum of 4 minutes**. After 2 minutes the players must change sides, unless they have already done so”.
Note that the Warm-up time has been reduced to 4 minutes.

The second part of the Warm-Up rules states:

- The players must have equal opportunities to strike the ball. **A player retaining control of the ball for an unreasonable time is warming up unfairly and Rule 15(Conduct) must be applied**

Herein lies the problem with the use of the words “unreasonable time”.

Unreasonable time is left to the discretion of the Referee and can vary for Referee to Referee.

What we have been seeing happening more and more is one player striking the ball four and five times followed by an un-hittable cross court.

The problem escalates when the opponent hits the ball six times in retaliation.

It is then left to the Referee to intervene apply a Rule 15 (Conduct) to one or both players.

Following discussions with Referees and coaches a guideline to what is reasonable is for one player to hit the ball back to themselves twice (maximum) followed by a cross-court to the opponent who repeats the process.

Who is responsible in the first place to ensure a Fair Warm-Up?

Is it the Player by being aware of the rule?

Is it the Referee by applying the rule?

Is the Coach by teaching the player of the rule and etiquette of the Warm-Up?

Answer: It is a combination of all three!

Remember the Warm-up is to warm the ball up and not the player

Also remember the Referee is in control of the match from the time the players commence the Warm-Up until the players leave the court at the end of the match.

2020 Cambridge Junior Teams Challenge

Our Junior Teams tournament was back on and once again we received 20 teams (60 players) from Cambridge, Mirrabooka, Blue Gum, Maddington/Gosnells, Marmion, Vic Park and Belmont.

Due to the crammed few weeks of events, it was a bit hard for country players with country week and state champs so we couldn't attract them this year. Also factoring in we didn't have many of our state team players entered which made the turn out even more impressive. I'm sure if we could get the right weekend, there is no reason this type of tournament couldn't go close to cracking the 100 participants in years to come.

Covid has impacted a lot of other sports as well, as such I found the scheduling a bit of a challenge trying to accommodate hockey, floor ball, soccer, football and netball commitments from a number of players! Still with the round robin format we were able to accommodate all the players and make it work.

With Cambridge's ever growing Saturday club hit attracting record numbers, we couldn't kick off until 12pm on Saturday, so parking was well and truly at a premium! We got away pretty close to on time with a couple of rounds to be played Saturday afternoon before kicking off at 9am Sunday morning.

Maddington/Gosnells dominated the top 2 divisions with Daniel, Eric and Alexander Marsh progressing through the tournament with a clean sheet, not dropping a single game between them. Cambridge 1 featuring Sam Jobson, Matthew Coker and Joe Wilkinson finished 2nd with some tough matches along the way.

Division 2 though wasn't as clear cut and it came down to some really close matches in the final play off. Georgia Gould (Cambridge 3) going down to Jay Thomson (MDG 2) 11-9 in the 5th which was the deciding result with the other two squaring off with wins in 3.

Division 3 came down to points as we had a 3 way tie for 3 wins and 1 loss between Belmont 1, Cambridge 4 and Mirrabooka Ninjas. Belmont 1 was just a little bit cleaner overall on 56 points, Cambridge 4 on 52 and Mirrabooka Ninjas on 47.

Division 4 was split into 2 pools with a cross over match. The final matches saw Marmion 5 v 6 in the final, Vic Park v Blue Gum playing for 3rd and Mirrabooka Galaxy v Force for 5th. This division featured a lot of players in their first ever tournament, so was great to see them all getting stuck in.

Young Jonathan was our super sub filling in the final spot needed at 6pm Friday night for Blue Gum 2! Another 5 set result being the difference in the final play off to see Mathys's 11-7 in the 5th win get Marmion 5 over the line.

I think it would be great to see a few more tournaments using this teams format take place across the year. From the two we have run, we have seen lots of new juniors playing for the first time along with a really good atmosphere behind each court.

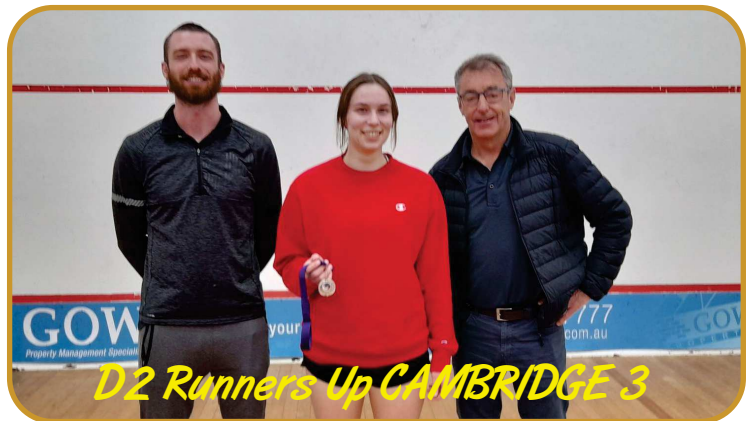

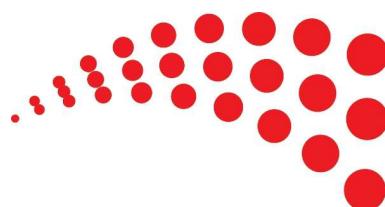
