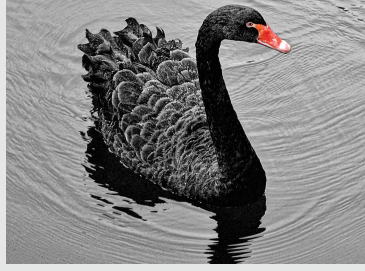

Dean's Diary

The Cambridge Open was held late November and two very familiar winners once again were crowned Champions in Mike Corren and Erin Classen. Sadly, the ladies final was a little one sided as Amanda Hopps was hobbling with a possible calf/achilles problem so we wish her well. The Men's once again saw Mike "moose" Corren defeat Dave Ilich 3-0 and sadly, our young crop of talented players could not break through these two tough players.



Squash Australia held their AGM in November and WA was represented by Glenn Hitch (President) and Leigh-Anne Kaye (Vice President). We saw **Greg Blycha** (pictured) from Subi Kings appointed onto the Board of Squash Australia ... congratulations Greg and I'm sure you will do a great job in bringing back some much needed wisdom into the running of squash in this country. God knows we need it !!

Following on from my monthly stories as a touring professional for over 12 years, one of the greatest learning habits I, and all the Aussies did, was to watch as much as we could the better players and look for any chinks in their game.

I remember vividly one cold morning in January in London when I went down to our club called Lambton Squash Club where we were allowed to train before the club actually opened and if the courts weren't booked out we stayed on.

This particular day in 1976, I arrived with my good mate Frank Donnelly and noticed that someone was training solo on one of the courts ... it was the great Jonah Barrington. Frank and I just watched him train for hours and we never

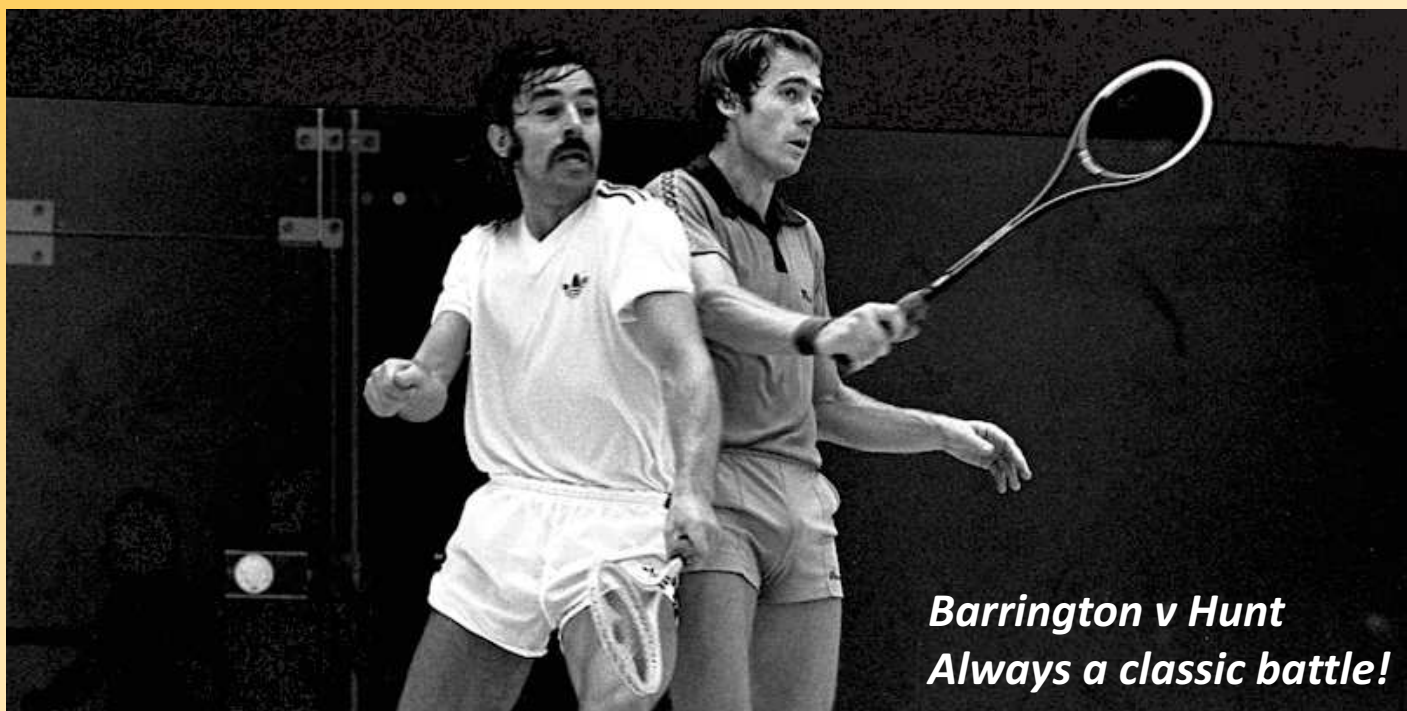

moved, mesmerised by his routines. His “ghosting” is legendary as we now know but we had never seen it. He never stopped moving as he set up shots and ran to get the ball and play another shot as if he was trying to beat himself.

His down the wall routines were so different. He played one shot down the wall and then a boast and then a down the wall shot on the opposite side, not just once but hundreds of times. Setting himself up so as to be able to do this continually.

After about 2 hours he asked us if we would like a hit and we jumped at the chance. Little did I know that only 3 years later I would be playing him in the World I.C.I Masters (the end of year big tournament for the top 16 ranked players) and the semis of the South African Open in 1979.

I just feel that these days our top juniors and senior players do not spend enough time watching other players and analysing their games. At a certain level when you are fit enough and strong enough the game is then a strategic game and you need to know and understand many game plans to combat the different styles and techniques of players. Its “what’s between the ears” that then counts!

“Times”

One of the duties of the Referee is to control the times allowed for in the rules in order for the match to flow smoothly and not give any advantage to one player over the other. It is important for the Referee to do this and maintain control of the match.

Once upon a time there was a 1 minute break between each game except for between the fourth and fifth game where was

a two-minute break. This has eventually been amended to allow a 90 second break between all games. In PSA sanctioned events 2 minutes is allowed between all games.

Both of these time limits require the players to be back on court ready to commence play at the call of TIME.

To achieve this the Referee prior to the end of the break period must call 15 SECONDS which warns the players to start moving back onto court to be ready to commence play at the call of TIME.

Both of these times are maximum period of time and there is nothing to prevent the players commencing play without using the full allowable break time if they both agree.

Other time periods are: -

1. Warm up – 4 minutes.
2. Time between end of warm up and start of 1st game – 90 seconds.
3. Time to change defective equipment – 90 seconds maximum. This is not to be treated as a chance to have a drink, talk to the coach etc.

Therefore, it is important that the referee has some mechanism for keeping record of time. It used to be a stopwatch or watch. In these times it can be the mobile phone, I-Pad, fit-bit watches etc.

What if I don't come back on time you may well ask.

The Referee has the choice of: -

- Conduct warning
- Conduct stroke
- Conduct game
- Conduct match

Usually the application of the “Conduct Warning” is sufficient penalty to ensure a player is back on court within the prescribed time.

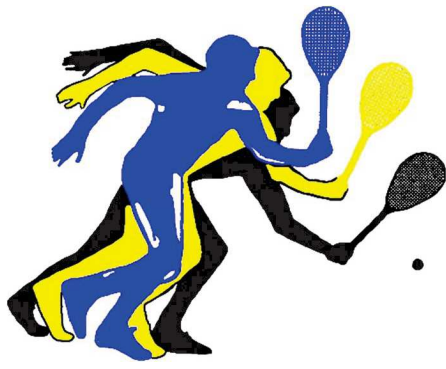
What if we both don't come back on time you may well ask.

In this case the Referee would apply the appropriate Conduct to both players.
But I didn't hear you call 15 seconds or TIME

It is the players responsibility to be close enough to hear the calls of 15 seconds and TIME. Of course, there other times which apply to injuries but we will deal with that at another TIME. Just remember stick to the times and there will be more time for supper!
